WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?

- The Unicef RRSA supports schools across the UK to embed children's human rights in their ethos and culture.
- The award recognises achievement in putting the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) at the heart of a school's practice to improve well-being and outcomes for every child and to help all children realise their potential.







WHAT DOES IT INVOLVE?

- The whole school community learns about rights and sees them as underpinning our values, vision and mission
- Mutual respect for rights informs all practice and relationships in school
- External validation recognises that we have embedded children's rights into our school's practice and ethos



THE THREE STRANDS

What is being looked for?

- knowledge and understanding of children's rights
- ethos and relationships
- the empowerment and participation of children/young people



THE RRSA JOURNEY
