More lesson observations will be carried out by the PE Lead, Kickstart manager and SLT.

Continue to provide opportunities for pupils to be more active throughout the day; Mytham Mile, Mytham Motivator, Sport Leaders Play Leaders, skipping. A programme of activities has been in place throughout the year in both key stages. Other activities - skipping, Mytham Mile and Mytham Motivator - have not been as popular this year. Kickstart after school clubs - 44% of pupils across school have attended these after school sessions (34% key in stage 1 and 49% in key stage 2).	The specialist sports teacher will return at the start of the Autumn term to carry out the training with the new Year 6 co-hort. Play Leaders and Sport Leaders will then be selected for the new school year (they will be called Activity Leaders collectively going forward). The Mytham Mile, skipping and the Mytham Motivator will be a priority and will be re-launched with the help of the new Activity Leaders to try and encourage more participation in the new school year.

These were paid for by parents and subsidised by sports funding. 20% of pupils across school have attended these sessions (23% key stage 1 and 18% key stage 2). New goalposts and netball posts were purchased for use in the after school clubs.	A new Dance/Yoga coach will start in the new school year and sessions will continue to be offered across both key stages. New Gymnastics mats will be purchased as the old ones were condemned during the most recent safety inspection. The school will take part in the Bolton Dance Festival in October for the 4 th year. Yoga will be introduced in EYFS and school will also look at reintroducing the parent and child Yoga sessions after school (which were very successful pre-Covid).
