The rest of the school have used <i>Real PE</i> . The use of the new scheme (PE Planning) in upper KS2 has been successful and pupil voice shows that children thrive and make better progress when they are participating in sports specific activities whilst still reinforcing the fundamental movement skills. A sports specific curriculum will also prepare pupils better for future physical activity at high school.	The whole school will move to using <i>PE Planning</i> and CPD needs will be identified as a result of monitoring.
